Some Questions That Have Been Asked:

Q As a non-Catholic, a question is, why do Catholics pray to Mary? Do Catholics adore or worship Mary?

A. To understand why Catholics, pray to Mary, you must first know that Catholics do not worship or adore Mary or the other Saints. We worship God alone. To pray to Mary or a Saint is to ask them to intercede on our behalf, just as we would a friend on earth.
Since May is a month dedicated to Mary, so one tradition we have at St. Mary's is to bring flowers and put these around a stature of Mary. We will pray the rosary (composed of Hail Mary's and Our Fathers) for the children and families in school and your needs. We will also pray for peace in our world, especially the people in Ukraine.
