# **International Walk to School Day 2019**

Eight schools in Moscow plan to join thousands of students from around the globe to participate in **International Walk to School Day on Wednesday October 2**<sup>nd</sup>, **2019**. Participating schools include: A. B. McDonald Elementary, J. Russell Elementary, Lena Whitmore Elementary, Moscow Charter School, Moscow Middle School, Palouse Prairie School of Expeditionary Learning, **St. Mary's Catholic School**, and West Park Elementary. International Walk to School Day is a global event with students all around the world walking and biking to school on the same

day. This year Moscow Safe Routes to School would like to highlight the environmental benefits of walking and biking to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve air quality, and promote environmental justice for low-income communities and communities of color.

Walking in an organized group with supervising adults is called a Walking School Bus. All Walking School Buses will be assisted by school personnel, parents, and Safe Routes to School volunteers to ensure safety and on time arrival to school. Parents and guardians are welcome to join a Walking School Bus with their student.
